Dear Friends,

I am delighted to be able to share with you the CMD Learning Programme for the first half of 2022.

The primary purpose of Continual Ministerial Development (CMD) is to support the ongoing formation of leaders, lay and ordained, so that they may be inspired and equipped to confidently live out the good news of Jesus Christ. In doing so we are seeking to embed our diocesan priorities for growth: *discipleship and evangelism, collaborative leadership and transforming communities* all of which form part of our vision of renewing hope.

In the pages that follow you will find events, courses and days that seek to pay attention to the heart, soul, and mind of our leaders. Therefore, it is my hope that you will find something within this offering that captures your curiosity, stretches your imagination, and restores your soul.

Alongside courses and events, the brochure signposts to external organisations, partners and agencies that are offering training that may be of interest to you. Please note that 'external' events will be administered by the host organisation and not via Parish Support.

Licensed ordained ministers can apply for a [CMD Grant](#) that equates to 1% of the annual stipend. This grant can be used towards covering the cost of courses, events or retreats connected to your ongoing formation and wellbeing.

The brochure also contains important links to resource wellbeing. As part of our **wellbeing support**, it is timely to highlight the following:

- **Spiritual Direction** – we have a network of Spiritual Directors, whom we call Spiritual Accompaniers, available. If you are seeking a Spiritual Accompanier, please do contact me.
- **Reflective Practice Groups** – the diocese offers places in Reflective Practice Groups to any who would find this helpful. The groups are currently externally facilitated. Groups are organised geographically, and we normally expect to start at least two groups in the Ramsbury area and two groups in the Sherborne area each year. To request a place, or for further information please contact Sue Chandler (sue.chandler@salisbury.anglican.org)
- **Counselling** – if needed a counselling provision is available. The diocese will normally pay for the first six sessions and part pay for a further three. This scheme is completely confidential, and the only feedback received are generic trends. The counselling service is available for you and any members of your family who live with you (children up to the age of 19). - **Retreats** – there is an expectation that licensed ordained ministers will take the inside of a week once a year as a retreat and in this diocese the cost of the retreat is a parish expense and should be included on your expenses in the normal way. When claiming the mileage associated with your retreat, please remember that mileage to places outside the diocese must be claimed at 30p per mile (rather than the 45p per mile inside the diocese).

Late spring early summer we will circulate the CMD brochure for the second part of the year, but it is worth noting that the annual **Clergy Day** is currently scheduled for **Wednesday 13th July**, at Bryanston School. We are also planning on running 4 archdeaconry days in the autumn term. Details of which can be found on [page 38](#) on this brochure.

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Rural Hope Flex – Leading together for mission

The Rural Hope team is delighted to announce that we are launching a new training resource - **Flex** - to help you tackle the challenges of ministry and mission in the post-Covid environment by building a truly collaborative leadership team.

As the name suggests, Flex is highly flexible and attuned to your needs.



Flex is not a 'course'. There are no textbooks or essays. Rather, it provides space for you and your colleagues to grow together as a group and develop new ways of working in a strong interlocking team. It gives you time out to reflect on what God is calling you to do both as a church leader and as part of a ministry team.

Life after Lockdown is certainly providing us with a range of challenges. But Flex will equip you to navigate the new world of hybrid church and digital discipleship whilst not forgetting those who simply want to come and worship as they have always done.

Flex will be run over four **Saturdays in 2022 (29 January, 30 April, 9 July & 15 October)**. Each Flex learning community will consist of 5 to 6 benefice teams of around 4-6 people each. Teams can be lay-led with the support of their Incumbent.
