With the end of 2019, specifically in the month of December, the epidemic appeared for the first time in China (the city of Wuhan) and from there it spread throughout the world and the global economy was affected due to the closure of International borders and the cessation of international air travels, ships, land transport and even within countries, and this led to complete economic stagnation, in addition to home isolation, quarantine, and the loss of many jobs, especially for the

poor and those with daily business. The epidemic is still spreading. In Sudan, like other countries, Covid19 cases continue to increase, reaching more than 12,000 cases now. Many experts and scientists has warned of a second wave may hit the world again. The church has taken a number of necessary measures to prevent the spread of the virus among the believers after the decision to open places of worship, such as

1. Disinfection of places and hands
2. The use of masks in church if possible.
3. Shortening the time for prayers.
4. Not to shake hands after praying
5. The Holy Communion can be conducted, but on the condition that it be by dipping the bread in wine or drinking from one cup should be avoided or use small glasses if found in church.
6. The rest of the activities will be suspended until further notice.

The Director General of the General Administration of Religious Affairs visit to the Province

The Director General of the General Administration of Religious Affairs in Khartoum State, Sheikh Dr. Muhammad Hamid Yunus, affirmed that the monotheistic religions called for religious tolerance and coexistence, achieving social peace and calling people to good. This came during his visit to the ECS office in Khartoum. He explained the importance of instilling the values of love and tolerance among all citizens, noting that social peace is based on respect and love, and that the citizen has the right to practice his religious rituals freely and peacefully. He was received by Archbishop Ezekiel Kondo bishop of Khartoum.

The Archbishop welcomed the visit of the delegation of and provided an introduction to the Episcopal Church indicating that five ecclesiastical diocese are located in the states of Khartoum, Port Sudan , El Obeid, Kadugli, Wad Medani and they all call for peace, love and unity. He said in the period of the former regime the church has suffered in many ways. He added we hope that the glorious December revolution and its government will achieve comprehensive peace in the country.
