Introduction

The Episcopal Church of South Sudan Task Force works with South Sudanese Development and Relief Agency (SSUDRA) the Development and Humanitarian Arm of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan because of its experience in project implementation that serves the interests of its members offering humanitarian support and also encouraging them to be self-reliant.

Project Overall Goal:

Increased and enhanced access to essential sanitation services, knowledge, and appropriate behaviours to practice good hygiene for prevention and mitigation of COVID-19 and WASH related diseases.

Since the establishment of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan Task Force in March, it has been engaged in many activities as to respond to the COVID-19 pandemic in the country.

In December 2020, the Task Force of the Episcopal Church of South Sudan carried out the following activities.

Solution Distribution of Food Assistance to 1,000 households in dire need of food Aid.

Episcopal Church of South Sudan Task Force for Coronavirus carried out assessment and registration of 1,000 households in the Five (5) Archdeaconries of Diocese of Juba and All saints Cathedral.

- 1. Gabat Archdeaconry- 9 Parishes
- 2. Kator Archdeaconry- 10 Parishes
- 3. Korok Archdeaconry-11 Parishes
- 4. Munuki Archdeaconry-13 parishes
- 5. Gudele Archdeaconry-12 Parishes
- 6. All saints Cathedral. The main Church in Juba

Category of targeted beneficiaries:

Widows with at least 4 children, lactating moths/breast feeding mothers, Child headed households/orphans, elderly, People with chronic diseases and people with disabilities. These categories of people are always badly affected in any catoptric situation.
