# CHURCHES TOGETHER IN ENGLAND

The pandemic has had an impact on many "Churches Together groups. Whilst the fruit of unity has been expressed in so many ways, many traditional activities have been put on hold.

A new **resource** on **re-imagining Churches Together groups** has been put together by three County Ecumenical Officers to help groups as they come together and re-focus after the pandemic. Read it <u>here</u>

The broadest ecumenical gathering of Christians in England, the **CTE 2022 Forum, 'Reconciling Hope – a Broken Church for a Broken World'**, inspired by Corinthians 5:19, takes place on Monday, 14<sup>th</sup> – **Wednesday 16<sup>th</sup> March** at the Hayes Conference Centre, Swanwick, Derbyshire, bringing together over three hundred representatives of Member Churches, Intermediate Bodies, Co-ordinating Groups and Bodies in Association.

The Forum is a delegate conference and therefore not open to all. Find out more about the event and how you might be able to attend <u>here</u> **Education Sunday 2021** will take place on **Sunday, 12<sup>th</sup> September**. It is a national day of prayer and celebration for everyone in the world of education, the theme devised by an ecumenical steering group representing different Christian denominations and organisations. # NEWS FROM THE DORSET CHURCHES

Churches Together in Poole, Boscombe, Verwood and Winton, Charminster and Moordown are meeting together in person. Verwood Methodist Church held a Healing and Renewal Service on 5<sup>th</sup> September and 12<sup>th</sup> September sees the launch of St Michael's in Verwood's Together@6 evening service. St Mary's Church in Weymouth has continued to offer live daily prayer on Facebook and St John's, Weymouth held an Open Air **Praise** event on 25<sup>th</sup> July. Simon Barrett from Rosebery Park Baptist Church, Boscombe recently ran a course on the environment called 'Christian in Creation' which was well-attended and Churches Together in Boscombe are planning an outdoor harvest festival service on Sunday,  $3^{rd}$  October, to be confirmed.

**Immanuel Church** in Southbourne has collected 394 boxes of supplies for Afghan refugees, the churches in Weymouth and Portland more than 500. On 23<sup>rd</sup> June, **Moordown** Memory Lane was launched at Bournemouth Community Church - a weekly reminiscence group in partnership with **PramaLife**, which is open to all but is particularly aimed at anyone living with memory loss or dementia. Anyone interested in attending or helping can call Tona on 07999 4021560 - or Tess on 07912 272077, if you cannot take part on a Wednesday.

Holy Trinity Church in Weymouth has offered premises to a new support business, the Weyshare 'Library of Things' project, which encourages people to reduce waste and save money by loaning and borrowing items. People can take part by signing up to the project's website or Facebook page. The church is also intending to reorder part of the church as a hub for debt advice, welcome and support for businesses who are struggling.

Working with local organisations, SMILE (for lone parent families), which is supported by Faithworks, arranged an action-packed programme to get young people out and about during the summer months. Activities included a swimming day at Greenhouse Christian Centre ; activities, a picnic and games at Urban Heath ; a beach day; a retreat at Longmead Community Farm. They are continuing their yellow Cook Bags in partnership with the Friendly Food Club, providing fresh ingredients and a recipe for a healthy family meal. Read more here
