- Especially important to give children video experience for a faith that is not 'visible' in a village school. Some use Wiltshire Agreed Syllabus - so that teachers research the background a bit more. This means it is enriched language. Wiltshire Key concepts documents are really helpful.

From Alison Urchfont Primary : **Thank you for the populated floor plan A3 for catching reflective comments from children. Idea will also be useful for governors when visiting classes and catching pupil voice.** (This was a suggestion where the teacher has an A3 sheet with the name of every child in the class on it. During the lesson, their comments/learning and teacher assessments are captured as evidence. We discussed how this is a helpful and manageable approach to in-lesson assessment - and helps you note which children have not contributed.)

From Jo Needham Woodborough CE Primary : **Talked about possibly using Christian stories as a starting point for bringing to life with figures then introduce into other world faiths.** Great idea, to start with a story in which the 'teller' has confidence.

From Catherine Wallace - Bishops Cannings : **We discussed how the children could imagine themselves as Mohammad and how he would have felt. Another good idea that was shared was using a visualiser with the sandtray and tracing Mohammad's path in the sand (as we wouldn't have an image/model of him).** Great ideas!

From Adam Watkin St Laurence : **Just linking to the reflective story telling. There are some wonderful stories of Muhammad in the Hadith here is a useful link** <http://www.lightofislamacademy.org/wp-content/uploads/2020/04/40-hadiths-for-children-with-stories.pdf> Thank you Adam! I wonder whether students in KS3+ might enjoy making reflective story scripts and filming them in IT/RE work.

- **Some colleagues have focused on vision**
- **took the decision not to teach the school's normal long term plan, or to start a new module of learning in RE.**
- **Pupils have enjoyed finding out more on a theme/research project of their own.**
- **For next term some schools are looking to reconnect with school and wider community, using the vision.**
- **Also looked at Spirited Arts competition which has led to good discussions with children in school but unsure whether parents will have engaged fully with this at home.**
- **Will need to look at RE across the school for September. We felt there will be significant gaps in learning.**

14:57:22 From Adam Watkin St Laurence : **We are going to move around units and reteach certain key concepts. The home learning did not cover the SOW that we normally cover**

14:57:45 From Karen Goodwin St George's Langton : **Out of interest, how many of you favour floor books over individual books for RE in primary schools?**

- From Pauline St Mary's Broughton Gifford : **We have used floor books for a couple of years - some are very good. Examples shown at a meeting earlier in the year which is probably on the website**
- From Georgie Motcombe Primary : **My school uses Floor Books for EYFS, 1, 2, 3 and 4 and individual books for Yr 5, 6 plus a class floorbook. :)**
- From Charlotte - HLP Crockerton CE Primary : **I use individual work books and a 'wall book' which is a working wall that I then photograph and show on the Smartboard to reflect back on prior learning. This is not whole school yet but has been VERY effective and I will be rolling it out.**

Floor books or individual books – either are fine if used well. Key points – ensure you have consistency across the school in terms of quality (you can do what Georgie's school does and have a policy decision on which classes will use individual books and which floor books). Aim to capture the range of creative work which is sometimes easier in a floor book. Check that all children are represented in a floor book and think how you will capture evidence for assessment. Charlotte's suggestion for a 'wall book' (either physically made to look through from photos of displays, or in virtual form – eg an ongoing powerpoint of RE learning) is a good idea that some schools are exploring. The images are useful as a reminder to children who sometimes have a better 'visual memory'. If you are, then do share images you are happy for us to put into a future training session!
