My name is Helier Exon and I am a retired priest living in rural Dorset. I have been engaged in the ministry of spiritual direction for over twenty years and have been a supervisor for about fifteen years. I started my working life in the armed forces and during that time trained as a Reader.

When I left the services I joined a management consultancy firm where I worked on several defence related projects for ten years during the last three of which I trained for ordination with STETS and was ordained in 1999. I took early retirement in 2000 and served as a self-supporting minister until 2014 in a number of parishes in central Dorset.
