Curate's Crazy Cycling Commences

This Thursday (15th July), at 5.00am, the Curate of St James' Church Devizes, Richard Saint, will start his challenge of ascending 10,000 metres on his bike using the online cycling platform Zwift.

He is doing this to raise awareness of modern slavery and to raise funds for Hope for Justice as they strive to live in a world free from slavery.
