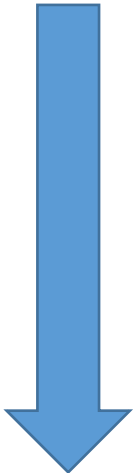

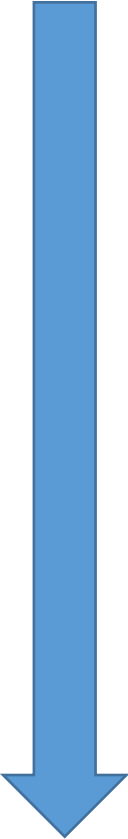
**Is this a worship service or a meeting of a group/club?**



**WORSHIP**  
Have schools broken up?  
OR Restarted



**NO**  
Children must stay with their households. The church cannot host a crèche.



**YES**  
You can hold Junior Church groups, with the same guidance that applies to meetings on church premises. Children returning from Junior Church into main worship must return to their households and remain with them for the remainder of their time at church. The church still cannot host a crèche.



**MEETING**  
Is this taking place in church premises, or in the church hall or community centre?



**CHURCH PREMISES**



**MEETING**  
You can meet in groups of up to 15, including leaders, with social distancing. You can have more than one group if there is space. The groups must be composed of the same people every time they meet. This does NOT apply to baby and toddler groups, which as of yet cannot meet.



**HALL OR COMMUNITY CENTRE**  
Indoors or outdoors?



**INDOORS**  
You can meet in groups of up to 2 households.



**OUTDOORS**  
No more than two households, including your support bubble, OR up to 6 people from different households (for example, 6 single people, or 3 couples, etc.)
